KLO ex-gen secy shares details of rebel group activities with cops

Kolkata: A day after surrendering, the general secretary of the Kamtapur Liberation Organisation (KLO) Kamal Kishor Ghosh apprised the state police forces of efforts by the rebel group's chief Jovan Singh to hold talks in Delhi and his future strategic plans. Kishor, who claimed on Thursday that most KLO members had fled from Bengal, has expressed his reservations about holding talks about a future Kamtapur without talking the state into confidence. His stand should be comforting given Singh's insistence to talk only with Assam CM Himanta Biswa Sarma and union home minister Amit Shah in this regard. Kishor has also informed STF officials that he has so far provided guerrilla training to over 200 young cadres and has set up a base at Kolla Hill in Chittagong in Bangladesh as part of the 7th batch trained by ATTF (TFD).

Women getting key role in water governance: PM

New Delhi: PM Modi laid people's participation, partnership of stakeholders, political will and optimum utilisation of resources as four pillars of strength that led his government to reach these milestones. He addressed the Jaipur Mission (JAM) and ODF Plus plan on Friday. "We have all chosen to work for nation building. That is why we are working on the challenges of the present and the future. Those who do not care about the nation are not bothered about solving the present or future of the country. Such people can definitely talk big, but can never work with a big vision for water," said the PM in a tweet. Union home secy Bhalla gets 1-yr extension, his third in post

New Delhi: Union Home Secretary Ajay Kumar Bhalla was on Friday given a three-year extension for a year, an order of the personnel ministry said. A 1964-batch IAS officer, Bhalla was appointed home secretary in August 2019. He was to retire in November 2020 after attaining 60 years of age. His tenure was first extended on October 17, 2020 till August 29, 2021. Bhalla's tenure was extended by one year on August 12 last year and he was to end on November 11. The order said the Appointments Committee of the Cabinet (ACC) has approved extension in service to Bhalla as home secretary for a period of one year up to August 29, 2023, in relaxation of the rules (FIS) and Rule 56(IA) of the All India Service (Death-cum-Retirement Benefit) Rules, 1955. Under the rules, besides the home secretary, others who can be granted extension beyond the age limit are the foreign secretary, defence secretary and heads of intelligence bureau and RAW. India's external intelligence agency. The service rules also provide provisions related to extension in service of such officers beyond the age of 60 years in "public interest" for such "period or periods" which may be deemed proper on a case-to-case basis for reasons to be recorded in writing.

Help in peaceful India ties, Pak PM appeals to international community

Jalambad: Pakistan Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif has expressed his desire for peaceful relations with India based on the principles of "equality, objectivity and mutual respect" and the "resolution of Kashmir issue", according to a report in Dawn on Friday. Sharif urged the international community to play a "facilitative role" to ensure durable peace and stability in South Asia, it said, amid a chill in Indo-Pak ties over Kashmir and cross-border terrorism. Sharif expressed his views during a meeting with Australian high commissioner to Pakistan.
